



TITLE I SCHOOLWIDE PROJECTS

Title I is the largest program of federal funding in education signed into law in 1965 by President Lyndon Johnson. President Johnson recognized the extremely difficult problem that children throughout the country were having with their reading and mathematics. In an effort to enhance student achievement, extra resources, materials and teachers are provided by the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, Title 1 (ESEA). On December 2015, President Obama signed into law the **“Every Student Succeeds Act”**.

The Title I law requires the meaningful engagement of parents in school level planning, development and design of initiatives to improve student achievement supported by Title I funds.

Our school's **Title I Parent & Family Engagement Plan** was developed following our review of the results from the **School Climate Perception Survey**. The survey is completed each spring by parents, staff, and students to provide an opportunity for them to share their opinions.

Title I Parent & Family Engagement

The Title I program for parents is designed to 1) Inform parents about Title I regulations, 2) involve parents in local Title I decisions, 3) provide literacy training, 4) offer parents training in schools and in the community on ways to work with their children at home to raise student achievement, and 5) encourage active participation of parents in their children's education.

- coordinate with programs and other agencies.

PROYECTOS PARA LA ESCUELA BAJO TÍTULO I

Título I es el programa más grande de fondos federales para la educación, firmado como ley en 1965 por el Presidente Lyndon Johnson. El Presidente Johnson reconoció el problema extremadamente difícil que los niños a través del país estaban teniendo con la lectura y matemáticas. En un esfuerzo por ayudarles a ponerse al día, se les proveyó atención adicional, materiales y maestros bajo el Acta de Educación Elemental Secundaria, Título I (*ESEA-Elementary Secondary Education Act*). En diciembre de 2015, el Presidente Obama firmó como ley el Acta "*Para Que Todo Estudiante Triunfe*".

La ley Título I requiere la participación consciente de padres en la planificación, desarrollo y diseño de iniciativas para mejorar el desempeño estudiantil apoyado por fondos bajo Título I.

El plan *para Participación de Padres y Familias bajo Título I* para nuestra escuela ha sido desarrollado después de haber revisado los resultados de la *Encuesta para Padres sobre el Ambiente y Percepción Escolar*. Los padres, empleados y padres participan en esta encuesta cada primavera con el propósito de ofrecer sus opiniones.

Participación de Padres y Familias bajo Título I

El Programa de Título I para padres está diseñado para 1) informar a los padres sobre las regulaciones bajo Título I, 2) involucrar a los padres en las decisiones locales sobre Título I, 3) proveer entrenamiento en alfabetización, 4) ofrecer a los padres entrenamiento en las escuelas y en la comunidad sobre las formas en que pueden trabajar con sus niños para aumentar el desempeño académico, y 5) motivar a los padres a participar activamente en la educación de sus niños.

Como escuela Título I, se requiere que la escuela **BridgePrep Academy of Tampa**

- proveer (según se solicite) oportunidades para reuniones regulares para que se permita a los padres (según sea apropiado) participar en las decisiones relacionadas a la educación de sus niños y responder a sugerencias,
- ofrecer horas de reuniones flexibles. Asegurarse que la información enviada a los padres está en un formato y lenguaje, siempre que sea práctico, que los padres puedan entender.
- coordinar con otras agencias,
- cada escuela Título I utiliza un porcentaje de los fondos asignados bajo Título I para apoyar un programa completo para la participación de padres.

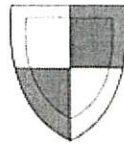

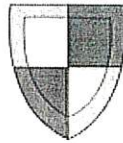

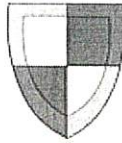
